MONDAY, MARCH 13, 2023**

The Darlington Township Supervisors met on Monday, March 13, 2023 for their regularly scheduled monthly meeting in the Township municipal building at 7:00 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Bill Ringling of Constitution Boulevard verbalized his frustration about the East Palestine train derailment.

Ron Stidmon of Little Beaver Road shared concern over the lack of reimbursement to those throughout the Township.

Sally Mahon of Ridge Road shared that she is so appreciative of the Township officials' efforts in handling the train derailment and asking the community to be patient with the progress.

Shirley Lambright of Little Beaver Road thanked the Township officials for their efforts and shared her frustrations with Norfolk Southern and the lack of accommodation and attention to Darlington Township.

Lori O'Connell of Oakdale Road shared concern regarding the use of different maps by different agencies, the lack of information and willingness of local PCPs to treat symptoms, and overall limited information.

Brandon Nalesnik of Valley Road shared concern about his property, the lack of communication he has received from several agencies involved, and the waterway behind his property.

Kristen Dorich of McCaughtry Run suggested the use of reverse 911 to communicate those evacuated, and relay that information to Norfolk Southern.

Kim Nalesnik of Valley Road expressed concerned about an independent test of a creek near her property and has not yet had DEP testing of the same waterway. She stated she is also concerned about her property value especial with the recent County Reassessment.

Rachel Wagoner of Constitution Boulevard indicated that her livestock are fine, and also shared that there is actually a lot of testing going on that people just may not be aware of yet.
